

# Statewide impact

Minnesota Amateur Sports Commission is an excellent steward of state funds.

Since 1987, it has supported the planning and construction of top-tier amateur athletic facilities across Minnesota. These facilities generate over **\$119 million in economic impact annually** and are attended by **5.5 million visitors each year**.

The MASC has administered grant programs that affect all corners of the state. Initiatives like the Mighty Ducks Grant Program which laid the cornerstone for our State of Hockey.
